Common Fungi Phlebopus marginatus Boletes are a type of fungi that are fleshy and at first look like ordinary mushrooms but differ on the underside of the cap. Whereas a mushroom has gills, a bolete has a spongy layer of pores. The caps vary in diameter from just a couple of centimetres to a metre. After the last rain look in your paddock for this unusual fungi. They are commonly known as fungal fruiting bodies or Sporocarps. The study of fungi is called mycology.


Note: ... and we have to fight to have our roads graded!!

# Winter Heating Tips

- The temperature of a heated room in winter should be between 18-21°C.
- Don't overheat. Every one-degree increase in temperature is a 10% increase in heating bills and emissions.



- Keep all doors closed so that the warm air is restricted to the area requiring heating.
- Install draught seals and weather stripping around doors and windows. Air leaks can account for 15-25% of heat loss from an uninsulated home and create uncomfortable draughts.
- Wear warmer clothing it's free, easy and will let you turn down your heater just those few degrees more.
