

Rainbow Lorikeet Trichoglossus haematodus

The Rainbow Lorikeet is unmistakable with its bright red beak and colourful plumage. Both sexes look alike, with a blue (mauve) head and belly, green wings, tail and back, and an orange/yellow breast. They are often seen in loud and fast-moving flocks, or in communal roosts at dusk..

The Rainbow Lorikeet is found in a wide range of treed habitats including rainforest and woodlands, as well as in well-treed urban areas. The Rainbow Lorikeet mostly forages on the flowers of shrubs or trees to harvest nectar and pollen, but also eats fruits, seeds and some insects. The eggs of the Rainbow Lorikeet are laid on chewed, decayed wood, usually in a hollow limb of a eucalypt tree. Both sexes prepare the nest cavity and feed the young, but only the female incubates the eggs. Rainbow lorikeet mating pairs stay together for life They're eaten by falcons and pythons. Wootton Fire Brigade News

The Bush Fire Danger Period

The statutory Bush Fire Danger Period runs from October 1st to March 31st, however it may vary due to local conditions. If you are planning to light a fire in the open during this time, you will need a permit. Depending on the type of fire, a permit may be required all year round or only during the Bush Fire Danger Period. For example, a Fire Permit is required at all times if a fire is likely to be dangerous to a building. RFS Fire Control Tuncurry (6555 5782, Mon-Fri 9.00am to 4.00pm) must be notified 24hrs prior to lighting of any fires. All neighbours must be notified 24hrs prior to lighting of any fire.

When are Fire Permits Not Required?

Fire Permits are **NOT** required for fires that are lit for the purpose of land clearance or the creation of a fire break during the NON Bush Fire Danger Period.

Additionally, fire permits are not required for fires for the purpose of heating or cooking, provided that:

- the fire is in a permanently constructed fireplace;
- at a site surrounded by ground that is cleared of all combustible materials for a distance of at least two metres all around;
- The fire is completely extinguished before leaving.

Permits will be issued on Thursday. To make an appointment for a permit, contact Mike Badcock on 49977337.

Howling in Wootton

Has anyone in Wootton recently heard the dingoes howling? They howl as a way of announcing where their territory is and make many different sounds to communicate within the group or to call pups that may stray. Because dingoes mate in Winter their young are about 5-8 months old now and are probably starting to wander. The haunting sound of a dingo's howl echoes through the valley as they call to each other. Dingoes don't bark so their sound is uniquely Australian. They are actually very timid and wary of humans (unless in a National Park where they get used to humans and easy access to food). Dingoes eat almost anything and are most probably taking advantage of the increasing numbers of rabbits around Wootton at the moment. A dingo usually lives in a small family group. Only the most important male and female are allowed to be parents but the whole pack will help to bring up the pups. A dingo pair stays together for life. Each dingo group has its own territory.

Some scientists think that the dingo is related to wild dogs that live in parts of Asia. Dingoes have been in Australia for about 3,500 years. They may have been brought to the country by Australian aborigines who traded with Indian traders. Aborigines kept dingos in their camps and the dogs hunted with the men. In Aboriginal languages, 'dingo' is warrigal, maliki, noggum, boolomo or mirigung.
