The Lilly Pilly Tree (Syzygium luehmannii) is a medium-sized coastal rainforest tree native to Australia and grown throughout This area. The berry has a tart cranberry-like flavour, with a hint of cloves. It has been a popular gourmet bushfood since the early 1800s. Local cooks use the fruit to make jam and wine, sauces, syrups and confectionary.






Wootton Hall Happenings



Topi Topi Sustainable Farming Group

Our Sustainable Farming Group met for the first time this year in February to visit a productive garden of unusual foods in Wootton, hosted by Peter Dixon and Megan Kessler. Peter and Megan shared with the Group their many reasons for choosing their property in Wootton, which included the mild, maritime climate, good soils and good rainfall. This area should be one of the least to be negatively affected by climate change, as shown by the Climate Report at:

http://climatechange.environment.nsw.gov.au During the visit, Peter and Megan shared how they have succeeded in growing over 1 tonne of vegetables a year, from over 60 different varieties. Their orchard of around 180 varieties of fruit trees will be bearing in the next year or two, increasing the variety of foodstuffs. Because of the microclimates and topography of the farm, they are able to grow on their ridge top tropical fruit trees not often seen South of Brisbane, while growing cold climate fruit in the valley below. At the end of the on-site presentation, the Group went to the Food Swap at the Wootton Hall and enjoyed a lovely afternoon tea.

The second meeting for the year was held in March and the topic was Oyster Farming at Wallis Lake, which was hosted by Lyn and Neil Clements. The Group met at the Clift Oyster Sheds at Tuncurry, where Peter Clift outlined the numerous steps involved with successful oyster farming on the Mid North Coast. At the completion of a very informative presentation, the Group went to The Colonels Café overlooking the shores of Wallis Lake to enjoy a delicious seafood lunch. Some members were fortunate enough to procure some scrumptious oysters and travel by boat, which made for an impressive entrance at the Forster Marina. An added benefit of this meeting was that we now know where to buy (and how to store) this fabulous fresh local produce.


