Australian Hornet (Abispa ephippium)

Mud wasps are solitary insects found in most parts of Australia. The adult feeds on flower nectar while the larvae feed on a larder of spiders and caterpillars built by the female. The females can sting but will only do this in self defence. They like a protected, dry place to safely lay their eggs in a clay dome and can often be seen hovering around buildings looking for a suitable site. If they happen to fly into your house, try leaving a window or door open for them to find their way outside so they can catch more spiders and caterpillars for you.


Healthy Farm Dams Course—Monday 27 May, Krambach.

WILD DOGS BAITING PROGRAM, KEEP YOUR PETS AND WORKING DOGS SAFE



Autumn is the time of year when many wild dogs are on the move, and the Great Lakes Wild Dog Control Group is are coordinating a baiting program. Many landholders have been trained to place and monitor the baits targeting dogs, foxes and feral cats. They will be placing letters in letterboxes including Wootton village with details of when the baits have been put out, as well as signs. Coordinator Art Brown 0400 136 544. Whether using baits or other methods, landholders can make a difference and Kay has shared some of her story about farming and managing wild dogs near Wootton. "We moved to the area in 1988 to farm deer, later Boer goats & Murray Grey cattle. One morning in December 2002 we found 17 of our animals either dead or dvina. This was our first confirmed wild dog attack, and it left us shocked, angry, and bewildered. What followed was many months/years of broken sleep checking nightly for signs of activity, and rushing out to noises like cows bellowing and dogs howling. Frustratingly most of this effort made little difference as we seldom saw the culprits & even more rarely culled them as we lacked tools & skills. Our losses (60), and those of neighbours (80 goats) and friends (100 deer) continued to rise. In early 2015 we purchased a wildlife monitoring camera and what a revelation it proved to be. Soon after we did a trapping course, and joined a reporting system to LLS and the Great Lakes Wild Dog Control

legal responsibility as a landholder to control feral animals on your property, but because it will help your friends, neighbours & the community at large, and their animals avoid suffering the way we did for so long."



WEED ALERT—COCKSPUR CORAL TREE

This spiny feral tree can become a major weed of waterways and other moist environments. Look out for its pretty red flowers now, it is deciduous and less obvious in winter.
