Lemon Migrant Butterfly (Catopsilia pomona)

Also called the Cassia Butterfly after their favourite food, these will land on flowers for nectar, but won't eat your garden plants. Females can suspend their development during droughts and delay



laying eggs. But their predators are less drought resistant, and rain in northern NSW means thousands of Lemon Migrants are flying south where they can lay 700-900



eggs. In 1770 they were collected by Europeans when the *Endeavour* was beached at Cooktown, and usually they only migrate as far as Port Macquarie. Other butterflies migrating now include the **Caper White**, **Jezebel** and **Blue Tiger**.



Thanks to all past librarians.


