Pied Butcherbird Cracticus nigrogularis So named because large food items are wedged in the fork of two branches and torn apart or butchered using the hooked beak. Adult males and females are considered sexually

monomorphic (a single body type) i.e. males and females look the same. It has a wide vocal repertoire, the most easily recognised call is a beautiful flute-like song usually heard early in day. Breeding is August to December.

Entry: The entry fee is \$10 per artwork, children \$2. There is a limit of 2 entries per person. The payment and entry form is due with the artwork on the delivery date.

Preparation of Artworks: The size of hanging artwork should not exceed 1 m sq. Work should be dry and ready to hang or free standing. All work must be clearly marked with artist's name, address and price (inc. 20% commission) and title of work.

A WIRES experience......

After receiving a teary phone call from my daughter, Llewellyn on her way to work, she told me she had found a wallaby on the highway that had been hit by a car and had decided to drag it off. On closer inspection she had found a baby joey still in it's mothers



pouch. I rang the WIRES number **49976388** and after giving an account of what had happened they advised me that they would be there within half an hour. I arrived at the scene with her sitting with it wrapped up in a jumper and holding it in front of her car heater as it was blue with cold. Margaret and Ron Seal arrived soon after and took the joey off our hands. Margaret placed the joey in a flannelette lined bag with a specially designed pocket for the hot water bottle and off they went.

We phoned that night and we were told that William, that's what we called him, had fed 7mls. She wasn't hopeful as he weighed only 250 grams and anything less than 350 grams would not have a good chance of survival. She had, though, nursed a 170gram joey back to good health. So it was possible. She rang us 3 days later and told us poor William had died. She thanked us for the efforts we had made to help him and asked whether we could put the WIRES phone number in the next newsletter to tell others who may find themselves in the same situation. I must congratulate the efforts made by the WIRES volunteers who spend many a night feeding young and injured animals, taking them into their own beds for warmth and caring enough to try. The Hessings have had a similar experience recently so be aware and call the WIRES number without hesitation.

Large Woody Debris (LWD) An essential element of a healthy stream

The LWD plays an important role in the physical and ecological health of rivers. What was once seen as a messy nuisance is now seen to improve stream health in many ways, such as habitat diversity and species richness. LWD enhances stream stability and improves water quality by creating pools and

encouraging deposition of sediment behind the logs, also creating a good foothold for water plants and algae to grow. All this makes for a healthier stream.
