#### Noisy Miner Manorina melanocephala

Sunday 14th October

The Noisy Miner is a honeyeater. Despite it's moderate size (28cm), it is an aggressive bird, chasing, pecking, fighting, scolding, and mobbing occur throughout the day, targeted at both intruders and colony members. It is a grey bird, with a black head, orange-yellow beak and feet, a distinctive yellow patch behind the eye and white tips on the tail feathers. A vocal species with a large range of songs, calls, scoldings and alarms, and almost constant noise. Noisy Miners are found in woodlands and open forests, as well as suburban backyards,



parks and gardens. It feeds on nectar, fruits, insects and sometimes small reptiles and amphibians. Highly social, it usually feeds in large groups and breeds in colonies, several broods being reared in one season. The female constructs the nest and incubates the eggs alone, but both sexes will care for and feed the young birds with additional male 'helpers'. It breeds July to December. Although it's population has increased the Noisy Miner is currently a protected species across Australia.

#### LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Pat.

We wrote to you earlier with some news regards Jack Smith, who settled in the Wootton area, and my mother (Loris) Hastten, the following to add to his profile.

My father John Smith purchased 300 acres of bush land at Wootton in around 1912 and set about clearing it for dairy farming. While doing this he also worked as a sleeper cutter, to keep the family going, up Allan-Taylor's line, on a steam engine into the bush.

His property was later purchased by Eadie Squires, in about 1946, who had lived there ever since, until her death (approx. three years ago). I am sure everyone in Wootton would know Eadie.

My Mum and Dad raised a family of ten children at Wootton and took an active part in all sport and functions in the area. Two of my brothers played rugby league and Dad managed the team with many successes. My youngest brother went away to high school in Maitland where he captained the cricket team. They were all excellent athletes.

My middle brother Harry (Cash, as all the Wootton folk knew him) was one of the first to enlist, when World War Two broke out, with the headmaster of Wootton school, Mr Sid Ham, a really wonderful teacher. We all began our school life at Wootton. There are seven of us still living. Our ages are Jack 96, Miriam 94, Alice 88, Clarice 86, Arthur 84, Myra 82 and Loris 79 (80 in October this year).

Sister Clarice also wrote...

My childhood was happy, I had a large family, milked cows, gathered blackberries and wild strawberries from the banks of our creek that ran through my Dad's property.

In 1940 my brother Harry came home to Wootton with his friend Jack Morris. That year Harry was sent to Egypt and Jack Morris was sent to Singapore. I played basketball at Wootton school and can remember my Mother's Sunday dinners and holidays at Harrington and Blackhead with the Maybury family (who owned the general store in Wootton). My friend at school was Ida Newton. I was 14 when I left school and later, during the war, I worked as a machinist at the ammunitions factory in Newcastle. There I met my husband Ralph Rowe and married in 1944. On our wedding day we were given a pair of blankets, it was the most memorable gift (together with my brother Harry returning home from the war) because of the war and they almost impossible to get.

It was the hardest of times for my parents, the loss of cattle, their son away at war and many other hardships but there were no complaints...my mum had a very happy nature.
