

White-winged Chough Corcorax melanorhamphos
This large, almost completely black bird, has a curved beak, a red eye and a large white wing patch, seen when the bird is in flight. They are found throughout most of eastern and south-eastern Australia, extremely sociable, almost always seen in groups of up to 10, raking through the grass and ground litter. Food consists of insects and some seeds. They walk with a



distinctive swagger, calling softly to one another every few seconds. Large feeding territories are kept, which are often up to 1000 ha in size. They do not reach sexual maturity until four years of age and, during this time, the eye changes from brown to orange and then to red, and the plumage darkens. The groups normally consist of only one breeding pair, the other birds being offspring from previous years. The offspring stay with the parents until maturity, helping with nest building, incubation and feeding of chicks. The nest is a large bowl of mud, which is built on a horizontal branch within 15 m of the ground. The eggs are cream-coloured, with large brown spots. When the chicks first leave the nest, they are not able to fly strongly until after 28 days, and are easy prey for feral cats and foxes. They will defend their nest territory during the breeding season with 'wing-waving' displays to deter unwanted intruders. Larger families have a better chance of breeding success so choughs will often kidnap the youngsters of neighbouring families in order to recruit them. Groups have been seen 'waddling' in Wootton recently where this photo was taken.

# Fire Risk

I was appalled recently when out for my morning walk. It was just after 6 am and the dog was keen. It was going to be another *stinker* of a day and had been declared a *total fire ban and catastrophic fire conditions*. The fires in the Blue Mountains were still raging. Our own Wootton fire brigade had been called out on numerous occasions, the winds whipping up smouldering fires or blowing down power lines and causing fires.

There on the side of the road, about 30cm from dry grass, was a cigarette end, still alight! I couldn't believe that in those conditions, with fires being reported every day on the news, that someone would be so thoughtless as to throw a lit cigarette out of their car window, so near potential fuel.

Recently, "fire investigators say a cigarette butt .... may have sparked a fire that destroyed 47 cars at Homebush Bay in Sydney's inner-west . Commissioner Mullins says if anyone is found responsible for throwing the cigarette, they could face severe penalties. "(It's) just irresponsible. Stupid. It's just stupid," he said. "If you're a smoker, put it out, don't throw it out the window, because things like this can happen." www.abc.net.au/news

The Fire & Rescue NSW website details a university study proving the potential for roadside fires from cigarettes dropped from cars. Also from their "Don't be a Firebug" campaign on their website: "It's enough to make your blood boil - the sight of someone throwing a cigarette butt out of a car window. Every year the Fire & Rescue NSW (FRNSW) is called to hundreds of roadside fires believed to be caused by discarded butts .... As well as the environmental cost associated with littering, there is also the potential for fires from dropped cigarette butts, particularly during bushfire season," he says. "A careless act by one person may have dire consequences for others, including the firefighters who risk their lives at fires." www.fire.nsw.gov.au From all accounts the potential for serious fires is increasing (hotter and drier) so hopefully this cigarette risk in Wootton is a one-off.

# Forster Aboriginal Land Council seeks land claim over the Wootton Way Reserve

This was lodged on September 15, 2009 but has only recently come to the attention of local community groups. The Council has formally objected to the claim. A report was tabled at the September 2013 council meeting outlining the recommendation to formally object. The reasoning is that the reserve has a community hall and other facilities which are lawfully used and occupied for recreation. The Council have submitted their report to the NSW Lands and Property Management Authority who will make the final decision about whether the claim is approved or rejected. We do not know when the decision will be made. However, if the claim is rejected the Forster Aboriginal Land Council will be able to make an appeal. I have asked Council if there is anything we can do at a local level to assist their submission and at this stage the feedback is that, no, we don't need to do anything. The Council submission should be sufficient.

### **Wootton Wildlife**

What have you seen lately?

- A pygmy possum in a palm tree watching the humans.
- Eastern Bearded Dragon eggs. These soft shelled oval eggs the size of a large marble, were accidentally uncovered whilst planting a tree. Laid in a shallow hole in the ground, they were re-covered and left alone
- A common snake-necked tortoise crossing Wattley Hill Road. When it feels threatened, this turtle will emit an offensive smelling fluid from its <a href="musk glands">musk glands</a>. This trait gives the turtle one of its other common names, "stinker", so think twice before picking it up.
- An *antechinus* (native mouse-sized marsupial carnivore) caught in the house and released. They do not gnaw on cables etc like mouse and are unlikely to eat stored food as they are carnivores and prefer insects and small lizards.

- Have you noticed the bright red of the *Illawarra Flame Trees* in flower on Mount Mistake and Mount Telararee in Wootton (Did you know that extreme caution must be taken with the dangerous, irritating hairs inside the seed pod. The hairs irritate the skin, are easily inhaled and have been known to cause blindness Royal Botanic Gardens website)
- Lots of birds, including the grey backed cuckoo shrike, the fig bird, dollar birds, King parrots,....
- The *red-bellied black snake* is out and about and has been seen often. (Let the editors know if you see something unusual or have a story to tell)

# **Etiquette for Wootton roads**

It has been observed over time that an increased number of drivers are showing a lack of courtesy while driving on the roads in the Wootton area. You may like to consider the following:



#### Dust

- Especially during dry times dust is an issue, particularly for those houses close to the road or down-wind so please drive slowly
- Passing people walking, cycling, riding horses, working please drive slowly to minimize the dust going into their lungs!

### **Passing**

- It is common courtesy to slow down and pull over to the left at the approach of an oncoming vehicle.
- Given the deep gutters on some roads it is courtesy for the 4 wheel drives and SUVs to allow more room for the 2 wheel drive vehicles
- If the road is narrow pull over where possible and stop
- If someone stops for you then at least acknowledge them with a wave!
- Stay on the correct side of the road
- On the steep and narrow downhills, where practicable the vehicle travelling up the hill should give way

#### Rubbish

- Don't throw rubbish out of your car windows. Take it home
- MacDonalds containers and beer bottles seem to be a particular problem. Again, take them home.
- Don't throw your cigarette butts out of your car window. It is litter and a potential fire hazard.
- It is illegal to litter.
