White Lily (Caesia parviflora var. minor)

This was discovered during the "Know your Bush" Day at Mike and Caro's place near a creek. This minor subspecies is considered endangered. It is a small plant up to 50 cm. The lily-like flower is about 1.2 cm wide. Flowering occurs in spring and summer.

The original specimen was collected in Sydney in 1803. In 1810, the species appeared in *Prodromus Florae Novae Hollandiae*, authored by the prolific Scottish botanist, Robert Brown. The generic name honours Federico Cesi, a 17th-century Italian naturalist. The specific epithet *parviflora* translates to "small flowered".

"Know Your Bush"

A field day at Kalybucca (Caro and Mike Badcock's)

Mark Graham, Nature Conservation Council of NSW, an ecologist working across northern NSW for over 20 years presented the workshop with around 20 attendees; many of them from outside the Wootton area. We were met at the gate by the call of the Pacific Bazza, a medium sized long tailed hawk. It was great to have someone, i.e Mark who immediately knew what type of bird it was. As we toured the property we stopped to investigate nesting nooks and crannies and a variety of plants. The tour took us past a gully area fenced off to protect the cluster of three types of palms (Bangalow, Cabbage and Walking Stick palms) growing together which is unusual in this day and age. We were honoured by a flyover from our sea eagles who regularly visit and our pair of black swans that we haven't seen for a year or so. While walking one of the creeks we came across a plant that Mark believed was quite rare, the white lily known as Caesia parviflora var. minor presented on the front cover.

Mark informed us that the property has a very good balance between pasture and native bush that greatly assists in weed management and maintaining biodiversity.

Thanks to MidCoast Council for organising and funding the day.

Fireflies in Wootton by Catherine Mann

One of the wonderful unexpected surprises I got when I moved to Wootton was the presence of Fireflies on my property. I was sitting outside about 7pm when I spotted two flashing lights in the bushes! Having seen them before, I was thrilled to find that they were in the Wootton area. I remember the first time I saw them I was amazed as I did not realise that they existed apart from fairy tale stories like Tinkerbell in Peter Pan. The next few weeks saw me avidly waiting for dusk to see them display their courting ritual of flashing to each other. They are actually a Beetle not a fly. The light is created by an enzyme (luciferase) which reacts with other chemicals in the insect's body to produce light energy. The males that flash the brightest attract the most females but the females also flash to attract the males. They live in the leaf litter and usually near water

sources. Apparently they are a sign of a good habitat so my severely neglected property has plusses and I have saved their habitat by not indiscriminately clearing the undergrowth. Light pollution is driving their decline, so turn off your house lights between early October and November if you wish to enjoy this wonderful experience and not disrupt their mating.

Wow! The last couple of months have been very busy! All our volunteers have attended numerous fires and motor vehicle accidents. Unlike the large fires at Karuah and Lime Burner's Creek, no household dwellings were under threat.

Looking into the crystal ball and excluding people doing rain dances the bush is ready to pose a serious threat to houses and property. The conditions according to most pundits is to remain dry (let's hope they are wrong). If you haven't done so already, make sure you have an updated Bush Fire Survival Plan that you are prepared to enact. Guidance on preparation of you plan can be found on the Rural Fire Services website

Fire permits: ring Fire Control at Tuncurry on 6539 7700 (Mon—Fri, 9am - 4pm). A Permit Officer, a volunteer from the Wootton Brigade will contact you to arrange for a time to visit you, assess the fire site and provide you with a permit. Even after obtaining a

Fred saving the wildlife permit you still need to give 24 hours notice to Fire Control and all surrounding neighbours, including National Parks (65910300) and State Forests

(6585 3744) if adjoining your land. Failure to comply with this rule could result in heavy fines.
