




DISTRIBUTION WOOTTON COOLONGOLOOK BUNGWAHL BUNYAH BULAHDELAH



Pat Tate recently saw this little bird on her place. She has never seen it there before and thinks it is here to eat the hairy caterpillars which nothing else seems to eat. They inhabit a wide variety of lightly wooded habitats, where they often perch on a fence-post or



exposed branch of a shrub. Being a cuckoo, they lay eggs in the nests of other species,



and often generate irate alarm calls of potential hosts. Birds are olive-brown above with pale scaling and a bronze to green sheen on the back and upper tail. Wootton Community Hall Announcement

This is an early notice that the Annual General Meeting of the Community Hall Committee will be held on *Saturday 24th March 2018*. All positions will be vacant and the Chair and Treasurer will be standing down from the Committee.

We need an active hall committee to keep the community events happening (e.g hall dinners, bush dance, Christmas party, workshops), an active library and to work with the WCN to ensure that the Wootton community's needs and aspirations are met. Currently there are negotiations between Council and the State Government (Crown) to hand back management of the Trust to the Crown. Earlier this year the Wootton community voted that the WCN expand its role to incorporate management of the Trust. The Council wholeheartedly supported and included this in their submission to the government.

The Hall is managed by local volunteers in a Section 355 Committee of the MidCoast Council who are the Trust Managers on behalf of the Crown for the Wootton Community Trust that covers the hall site. Until the negotiations are completed and a decision is taken the Hall committee will still be required to manage the hall and its surrounds under the Local Government Act..

Although I have taken photographs since I was a young man, I only developed an interest in photography as a hobby when I retired from work in 2006. In 2006 I joined the Forster Digital Photography Club (FDPC). I have been entering the monthly competitions since then and have progressed from D to A Grade. I was appointed President in 2009 and held that position for 3 years and then 3 years as Vice President. I am still on the committee and have been Web Master since 2010.

In 2006 I purchased my first SLR camera, a Sony A100 Digital SLR and started to learn Photoshop. In 2014 I upgraded to a Canon 5D Mk3 DSLR with 24-105mm and 100-400mm Zoom lenses. I process my images in Adobe Lightroom and Photoshop. Nearly all of my work stays as digital for display on screen and projector as FDPC is not involved with print images but I have started to print images to enter print competitions. Also this year I have entered National and International Competitions with the intention of applying for honours with the Australian Photography Society. This is a matter of collecting enough acceptances and awards to satisfy the criteria.

Most of my photography is done when travelling on holiday in Australia and overseas. It is just a bit harder to get motivated when at home, where there are many other distractions. Thank goodness we have had some rain but the bush is still very dry! So please be careful. Permits are required for open fires and are currently only available for small heaps—the type of fires allowable under permits is constantly reviewed but the decision is always dependent on weather conditions.

The Brigade has still been active fire fighting and attending motor vehicle accidents where unfortunately two of the accidents contained deceased people. The four new members have completed their Basic Fire Fighting training and will shortly be available for fire fighting duties and, importantly one has a heavy vehicle drivers license which will assist greatly in being able to provide crews in the large truck. Weed Alert - Tropical Soda Apple

A new outbreak of the noxious Tropical Soda Apple has been found at the Gloucester sale yards. An existing infestation around the Wingham sale yards is under management and surveillance. This spiky specimen causes pasture productivity to plummet and can run rampant in riparian areas. A few plants can form a hectare sized impenetrable thicket in as little as 6 months. It spreads via cattle, who won't touch the leaves but are attracted to the fruit, and shed its myriad seeds in their dung. This outbreak is a timely reminder to be careful to confine all new stock to a small, easily monitored quarantine paddock when they arrive on your property. Cattle take six days to eliminate viable tropical soda apple seed, and should always be quarantined for at least this long.
