All creatures great and small

Livestock are hungry and thirsty and so are the wildlife. You can help them by putting out bowls with clean water and contacting **FAWNA** if you find any in distress.

Many birds are being seen in Wootton that are not usually here, like the bright gold and black **Regent Bowerbird** (*Sericulus chrysocephalus*).

The drought, fires and windy weather are bringing many birds and animals into contact with human Woottonites. They are in gardens looking for grass and water, and in sheds and woodpiles looking for homes to live and raise their young.


MEET THE NEW COMMITTEE GATHERING The Wootton Community Network held a gathering on 19th October for the community to meet the newly elected WCN Committee. Those attending were also asked for suggestions about the operation and future activities of the committee.

Bill Buckland the new president described the activities of the committee since taking office on 14th September. He talked about the Strategic Plan Revision passed by the council on 25th October, the intention to update the Website, the creation of a new office in the cafe for the storing of the WCN and Crown Lands Trust documents and recent meetings he had with the Mid Coast Council and the Crown Lands Office.

Suggestion/Comment forms were provided to those attending and in response 19 suggestions/comments were received. *Megan Kessler* helped with developing the suggestions. The full list of suggestions and some extras provided by two people unable to attend will be issued to the community by email. Action taken by the committee will be added to the suggestion list as actions develop. Among the suggestions received were requests for a new dishwasher in the hall kitchen, upgrading of the fences and signage for the community centre, improvements to the Tennis courts and surrounds including some provision for youngsters. The possibility of doing more to let the community and visitors know about local businesses was discussed. A request was received to provide more information about "Code of Conduct" and "Conflict of Interest" documents as they apply to the Wootton Community Network activities. An email to those on the WCN mailing list has already been issued by the Committee on the matter of "Code of Conduct" and "Conflict of Interest".

Thanks goes out to all those who attended and gave worthwhile suggestions making this a successful gathering - *Bill*.

Wootton Fire Brigade

November has been extremely busy for the Brigade with 14 call-outs logged from 8-19 November alone. A lot of time has been spent attending the fires around Failford, Minimbah, Tuncurry, Old Bar, and further afield at Wherrol Flat, Johns River, Pappin- burra, Telegraph Pt. etc. We have been



stretched far & wide. Wootton, however, has been lucky so far with only 1 fire recently in Herivals Rd that was dealt with quickly, so let's all keep it that way. What should you do:-

Be extremely vigilant as the current dry weather patterns will be allowing fires to take hold quickly. Ensure you think twice and have a water sprayer and a phone with you before undertaking works in paddocks, using a quad, a rideon or mowing dry lawns around the house, having BBQ's, even lighting a mozzie coil, etc because a spark is all it takes.

Make sure your Bushfire Plan is ready to activate, check with Fire Control

Tuncurry 1300 643 262 if you are concerned. Listen to the radio for updates (ABC local FM 95.5MHz), keep your mobile on you for RFS Fire Alerts in your area. Keep an eye on the Fire Danger Level.

Total Fire Ban rules

No fires during a Total Fire Ban A total fire ban means no fires out in the open. A total fire ban helps limit the potential of fires developing.

During a Total Fire Ban you cannot light, maintain or use a fire in the open, or to carry out any activity in the open that causes, or is likely to cause, a fire.

General purpose hot works (such as welding, grinding or gas cutting or any activity that produces a spark or flame) are not to be done in the open.

The NSW RFS strongly recommends you **reconsider activities such as such using a tractor or slashing**, to help reduce the chance of a fire starting on your property. Under certain conditions, the NSW RFS may issue a Harvest Safety Alert www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/plan-and-prepare/farm-fire-safety/grain-harvesting-guide

Injured wildlife needs help, but unless you have been trained the best way to help on the Mid North Coast is to contact FAWNA on 6581 4141.

Emergency First Aid:- Cover it with a towel or blanket to minimise stress and firmly but gently place it in a cardboard box, or natural fibre bag if available. Try to make it as comfortable as possible. Keep it in a warm and quiet place away from domestic pets and children and resist the temptation to peek at it.



Then call FAWNA on 6581 4141 who will advise the best course of immediate action. Alternatively you can take the animal to a vet who will contact FAWNA to arrange collection. There will be no charge to you.

Bulahdelah Police Report – Holidays and Firearms safety

Many crimes occur during the **holiday season**. Here are a few simple tips if you are planning a holiday.

- Check that everything is locked and secured before leaving.
- Ask a friend or neighbour to park in your driveway.
- Ask trusted friends or neighbours to clear your mailbox and check on your home while you are away.
- Make sure that the lawn does not become overgrown.
- Stop all deliveries that you are expecting.
- If valuable items are left in the home ensure that your property inventory is up-to-date.
- Lock the electricity meter box to prevent thieves interfering with your power supply or security lighting.

With smaller rural allotments becoming increasingly popular the use of firearms can be an issue. There is no restriction on the size of a property for use of a firearm as long as it is used in accordance with the regulations.
