### Books for all ages!

<u>Kiddies</u>—come and see the new, donated children's books. <u>Adults</u>—fancy talking orchids?

We have received books about Australian orchids with photos of the many local flowers that you will recognise like Cymbidium suave and Sarcochilus falcatus (in trees); Dendrobium speciosum (in trees or on rocks); Dendrobium kingianum (on rocks); Caladenia, Pterostylis, Diuris, Thelymitra species and Spiranthes sinensis (in the ground).

You'll be amazed at all the variety of colours and shapes to be found at different times of the year, and what's growing where. They can be very long lived plants, easily 50 years, and usually have flowers with special scents or shapes that attract only a couple of insects to pollinate them.

The books have chapters on how to grow some of them in your garden. There's an orchid nursery at Tinonee and orchid clubs in Forster where you can find out more.

Did you know, Bulahdelah is home to an orchid that grows and flowers its whole life underground, and all orchids are "protected plants" so they should be left in the bush for others to enjoy?



#### **Cicada Cacophony Concert!**

We've all heard the cicadas singing this summer. Some can produce noise levels up to 120 decibels which can be quite distressing to us.

Cicadas are familiar insects to many of us because of their large size, their conspicuous songs in summer and the empty nymphal shells they leave discarded on tree trunks. Many large species are very common in suburban areas and childhood folklore surrounds them, many being known by quaint common names. Generations have grown up catching and swapping Green Grocers, Yellow Mondays, Floury Bakers, Black Princes and Cherry Noses. There are more than 240 different species of Australian Cicadas and over 800 species that call Australia home, varying in size from a wingspan of 20 mm to 140mm. Most are only active in the summer months and different species

#### **INCIDENTS**

The brigade has had numerous call outs throughout December and January attending bush, grass, & structure fires as well as motor vehicle accidents (MVAs) on the highway:

 January 7—the call out at 10.30 pm was like driving through a Hitchcock horror movie with huge lightning bolts and torrential rain bursts as we searched the highway from Bulahdelah to Wootton Way (north) for a reported fire —> false alarm!



• The team was one of the 5 brigades that made up the Mid Coast Strike Team that attended the Williamtown Airport fire on Sunday 14 January and were allocated a sector of scrub at the north end of the runway (protecting airport assets) which rapidly became the centre of the fire due to wind shifts and increasing intensity of up to 60 km/hr. Whilst we waited for the fire front to pass, helicopters of all sizes (including "Elvis") water bombed around us and the DC10 jet flew low overhead dumping loads of retardant. From a participant's viewpoint .... for such a huge multi agency task force, it was a well organised day!

A big thanks to the brigade members who attended all the call outs.

#### **FIRE PREPARATION**

Recently, the RFS AIDER (Assist Infirm, Disabled and Elderly Residents) team conducted a letterbox drop in our area. The AIDER program is a free, one-off service which supports some of our most at-risk community members.
