#### Yellow-tailed Black-Cockatoo

Calyptorhynchus funereus

The Yellow-tailed Black-Cockatoo is a large (55 - 65 cm) cockatoo. It is easily identified by its mostly black plumage, with most body feathers edged with yellow. It has a yellow cheek patch and yellow panels on the tail. They have a distinctive call which is a drawnout "kee-ow" and screeches. They feed in small to large, noisy flocks. The favoured food is seeds of native trees and pinecones. They also feed on the seeds of ground plants and insects. They have a long breeding season. Both sexes construct the nest, which is

a large tree hollow, lined with wood chips. The female alone incubates the two eggs. Farmers have a well held belief that the sight of a flock of cockatoos heralds rain.

"If you are lighting a fire outside the bush fire danger period for land clearing, for a fire break or in a way that might be dangerous to a building, you must notify your neighbours, the local RFS, Fire Control Centre (with at least 24 hours notice) and the local council, letting them know the location, purpose, period and time of the fire you will light. If you live in a built-up area, you must also give your local fire brigade at least 24 hours notice. If you do not notify the required people or obtain a permit, the penalties are very serious, and include fines and imprisonment. It is always a good idea to contact the RFS before lighting a fire."

"If a fire breaks out on your property, you must:

Try to put it out yourself; or

First Aid Officer:

If you cannot put it out unassisted, and it is practical to do so without leaving the fire unattended, contact: the local Fire Brigade, the Rural Fire Service, the Forestry Commission or the Dept of Environment & Conservation. The maximum penalty for not doing so is a fine of \$2,200 and/or 6 months imprisonment." (Rural Landholder's Guide to Environmental Law in NSW - copies available at the Brush Turkey Café)
