

# Gould's wattled bat Chalinolobus gouldii

The micro bats (also known as insectivorous bats), are small to medium-sized bats, weighing from 3g to 150g, and with wingspans of around 25cm. Micro bats are nocturnal, and rely on *echolocation* and, to a lesser extent, eyesight, to find their way and locate insects at night. Micro bats use an array of roost sites for sleeping during the day. The majority of micro bats roost in tree hollows or caves, although



some sleep under bark or under dead fronds of tree ferns, or even in the discarded nests of some birds! Some species will sleep in human structures such as in mines, tunnels, buildings, under bridges and in rooftops, especially if their natural roosts are in short supply in the area. They are the only flying mammals - and this is how they got to Australia. Australia's original mammals were only marsupials. Bats are placental animals, but because they came to Australia by themselves (i. e. they were not brought here by humans), they are considered to be Australian native animals. Microbats need a lot of energy to fly and to replace the body heat that goes out through the large wing and ear surfaces. A microbat can eat 50% of its bodyweight every night. But during the winter food is scarce and some species of microbats migrate, others hibernate

# Choko pickle

- •3kg (6lb) chokoes (after peeling)
- •1kg (2lb) onions
- •1 cup cooking salt
- water
- •1 ½ litres (3 pints) dark malt vinegar
- •5 tablespoons plain flour
- ●1 ½ level tablespoons curry powder
- •1 tablespoon turmeric
- •1 tablespoon dried mustard
- •1 kg (2lb) brown sugar

# Method:

Cut up the chokos and onions, add the salt, then cover with cold water. Next day scoop off the excess water, then boil the choko and onion mixture for 15 minutes. In a large pot mix together the plain flour (mixed to a paste with a little of the vinegar first), then the rest of the vinegar, curry powder, turmeric and mustard. Bring to the boil, stirring. Add 1kg (2lb) brown sugar and stir to dissolve. Add the cooked chokos and onions to the vinegar mixture and bring back to the boil. Cook 10 minutes more, stirring or until desired consistency is reached

What a great time to be in the country. We've seen our best season for quite a long time. The pastures are green, the trees are fruiting, the animals are reproducing. Weeds are in abundance and nature is exploding everywhere. Flooded Gum and Tallowwoods have been flowering for an extended period which has resulted in masses of parrots and Wattle birds in the day and flying foxes at night. Citrus and natives are fruiting profusely. The good rains have meant we don't have to water our vege gardens. Our water tanks are full to overflowing. We look forward to sitting in front of our warm winter fires eating our own produce (creamy pumpkin soup) and sipping local wines. It doesn't get much better than this. What a pleasure to live in the country!

#### **WOOTTON HISTORICAL RAILWAY WALK REJUVENATION!!**

During the week of 16-20th May 2011 two groups of volunteers worked on the picnic area at Sam's Camp and the walking trail of the Historic Railway Walk. The Australian Conservation Volunteers and the Wootton Weeders joined forces to make huge improvements to this beautiful spot. John Berry, from the Forestry Department, not only worked hard brush cutting and mending, but also provided paint, equipment and replacement parts for the picnic area as well as new sign posts and interpretive plaques to explain a little about the history of the place.



The Australian Conservation Volunteers, led by Raquel Ryan was made up of two students from Korea and 4 students from Hong Kong and a volunteer trainee. These students pruned, raked and cleared the picnic area, then scrubbed the car park fence before painting it and the picnic tables. The walking trail was raked, pruned and brushcut making a lovely wide path. The bridges were swept clean and surrounding weeds removed. The Wootton Weeders cleared a large area of lantana along the edge of the trail

Craig Tate brought along memorabilia including written history and old photos of workmen and trains and talked about the opening up of this area to logging and then the subsequent working party which rediscovered the rail line, or what was left of it. This working party made an historic walking trail along the rail line where the old hand-cut sleepers for the railway can still be seen today.

Many thanks to Raquel and her overseas volunteers, John Berry, Craig Tate and the trusty band of Wootton Weeders for their valuable contributions to this project. Sams Camp and the Historic Railway Walk are worth visiting for a picnic and a walk down memory lane.
