LONG NOSED BANDICOOT (Perameles nasuta) and NORTHERN BROWN BANDICOOT (Isoodon macrourus) When Tracy saw holes popping up everywhere, she was



happy to hear they were made by bandicoots and the mouse plague hadn't come to town. They dig conical holes to find and eat insects, earthworms, insect larvae, and spiders (including the venomous funnel web spider) as well as tubers and fungi. The two common bandicoots make at



least 4 distinct noises. A high-pitched, bird-like noise to locate one another; a "whuff, whuff" noise when irritated; a loud "chuff, chuff" noise with a loud whistling squeak when threatened or alarmed; a loud shriek when in pain or scared.

How are you coping with all the rats and mice?
Bird-Life Australia has a guide to bird-friendly rodent control, to help you protect your home, garden and farm without killing birds and predators that help control rats and mice naturally. Many household products – including Talon, Fast Action RatSak and The Big Cheese Fast Action brand rat and mice bait – have been banned from general public sale in the US, Canada and EU, but are available to purchase from supermarkets and retailers throughout Australia. Some can stay in tissues and organs for months, even years. Owls, kites and other birds of prey are dying from eating rats and mice that have ingested these Second Generation rodent poisons.

"Consider other, non-poison pest control, like snap traps, only put out baits when you actually need to, read the labels on any poisons you buy and make the change to first generation anticoagulant rodenticides (FGARs) or other alternatives. Look for active ingredients like Warfarin and Coumatetralyl or natural constituents like Sodium Chloride, and leave second generation anticoagulant rodenticides (SGARs) on the shelf." www.actforbirds.org/ratpoison

Peter and Megan's Recycling Quest

When *Peter Dixon* and *Megan Kessler* had to demolish their house so they could rebuild (termite damage before they bought), they wanted to recycle or have reused as much of the old house as possible. The NSW EPA is keen for people to deconstruct homes rather than demolish, and provide advice online at

www.epa.nsw.gov.au/your-environment/household-building-and-renovation

Sadly it was not as easy or cheap to find a deconstruction contractor as the EPA made it out to be. Quotes from demolishers who recycled or reused materials ended up being significantly more expensive than straight demolition, so they went on a quest to find friends, locals and strangers who wanted to salvage materials. The demolition company they went with was happy to work around the recycling idea and was happy to pull



down cladding and the housing frame to be taken away by a Newcastle firm who will build furniture from it.

Fittings and appliances were given away or sold. All up, about 95% of the house was recycled. It took a lot more time to coordinate than a standard demolition, but with that effort, they were able to have the house cleared away for about the same price as a standard demolition.
