Long Nosed Bandicoot

Perameles nasuta

The Long Nosed bandicoot is probably best known from the conical holes that it makes at night when it forages in lawns. It is searching for insects and succulent plants which it appears to locate by smell. Between bursts of digging it moves around sniffing the ground making a shrill grunt like squeak indicating it's presence. A Long Nose Bandicoot spends it's day in the nest. It is a solitary animal, contact between males and females being restricted to the minimum necessary for successful reproduction. Young are born after a gestation period of 12.5 days, the pouch opens backwards, making the journey to the teats quite short. Bandicoots have a



potentially high reproductive rate: it follows that there must be a high juvenile mortality. It's muzzle is long and pointed, ears distinctively long. Greyish brown above, creamy white below. Found in rainforest, wet and dry woodland and open areas.

Wootton Rural Fire Services

Fire season starts 1st October.
All fires (other than for cooking purposes) require a permit.

The Wootton RFS permit officer is Mike Badcock phone 49977337. Remember Mike is a volunteer. He isn't paid to do this, so if you need a permit remember he has a life too, so give him good notice as he has to inspect your fire site before issuing a permit.

Last Sunday was a taste of our forthcoming summer. Remember we had in excess of 6 inches of rain 2 weeks ago and already Sunday was terrible for fire conditions.

The Wootton brigade called in the Bulahdelah garbage tip fire and Keith Graham and myself attended in the tanker followed by Toby Bradbury in the striker. The bush between the tip and Bulahdelah Caravan Park was well alight and had crossed the highway into the Golf course blocking the highway. Many brigades fought this fire to secure the town and the sewerage treatment plant behind the tip. At 7.30pm Keith and Toby were relieved by Garry Williams and Bernard & Karen Caron. By about 8.00pm we thought we had the fire under control when a new fire had started up on Alum Mountain under the phone tower. This fire was in very hazardous terrain, steep and rocky. Worse still the fire had burnt through the security fence into the tower compound. Some specialised insulation had caught alight. 2 members of another brigade had to be hospitalised due to the toxic fumes from the insulation. By about 10.30pm a very exhausted brigade was stood down when we received a call from Garry & Bernard in the striker who had already headed for home that a large blaze was going in the Flora Reserve on the Wootton side of O'Sullivan's Gap. Fortunately we were still active and had just replenished our water. 6 brigade units took until after midnight to extinguish this fire.

The brigades who fought these fires were from Tuncurry to Tea Gardens and everywhere in between. Without such backup these fires would have been as destructive as the Picton fire on the same day. The Caravan Park was in the direct path of the first fire. Some of the volunteers had been on the fireline for 10 hours before the Wootton fire was called in. If you're fit and local join the brigade. We have been lucky so far. Eventually there will not be enough of us to respond to fire conditions like last Sunday if they last for days on end and that is when it could be **your** property in jeopardy.

Improving water quality. Can you help?

The water quality of Wallis, Smiths and Myall Lakes is the focus of the \$1.8 million federally funded Great Lakes Coastal Catchments Initiative. Through this project Great Lakes Council are working in partnership with landholders, local groups, agencies and the federal government to work out the best ways to improve water quality in the area. If you are interested in being involved, researchers would need access to your property during Spring and Autumn and will need to talk with you about how your property is managed. To establish water quality improvement plans for the three lakes we also would like members of the community to provide us with their views on the importance of our lakes and methods for improving water quality. Public meetings will be held during late October, early November for this purpose. If you are interested in working with us, contributing information to this project or simply want to find out more please contact the Coastal Catchments Initiative Co-ordinator at the Great Lakes Council ph: 65917374.
