Forest clematis Clematis glycinoides

A dioecious (male & female flowers on separate plants) woody climber, often flowering high in the forest canopy, but also commonly flowering near ground level. It climbs via petioles and petiolules that twist around host plants. It has an extensive rootstock and will sprout again from the rootstock after a fire. The feathery fruit/seed pods after flowering has given rise to the common name of 'old man's beard'. The leaves were crushed and



inhaled by aborigines to cure colds and headaches and has a powerful effect on the nasal passages. It has had a particularly long flowering period in Wootton this year, from August, and can be seen draped over low bushes and high in trees, almost everywhere.

The Bushfire Danger Period The statutory Bush Fire Danger Period runs from October 1st to March 31st, however it may vary due to local conditions. If you are planning to light a fire in the open during this time, you will need a permit. Depending on the type of fire, a permit may be required all year round or only during the Bush Fire Danger Period. For example, a Fire Permit is required at all times if a fire is likely to be dangerous to a building.

OCTOBER IS FIREFLY MONTH IN WOOTTON

Watch out for flashing lights in the early evening. Fireflies can often be seen cruising around in the forest and undergrowth. It is a small beetle that is commonly sighted in late spring, usually in wind protected areas of rainforest with high rainfall. The lights you see are the little lanterns on the underside of the abdomen of a carnivorous beetle. These beetles have been misnamed fireflies. It is believed that the flashing light is used by males and females to attract each other. The light is created by an enzyme (luciferase) which reacts with other chemicals in the



insect's body to produce light energy. The firefly regulates the emission of light by controlling the amount of air supplied to the cells. The regularity and intensity of the flashing may help fireflies identify males and females. This is one of the magical experiences of living in Wootton!

SUMMER GARDENING TIP



Use water wisely and also take particular notice of trees and other plants which can, because of lack of water, become stressed. It's when this happens that they express certain nutrient deficiencies. One really common nutritional deficiency is boron. Two other

common nutritional deficiencies are magnesium and potassium, and of course when plants are stressed by drought, watch out for pests because they move in. Wherever you live and whenever plants are affected by drought it's important to feed plants little and often. If you give plants too much food when they're under stress, this makes problems worse. The best way to feed plants during drought stress is to use a water soluble fertiliser so you feed as you water the plants.
