Superb Lyrebird Menura novaehollandiae

The male is 80-100 cm long, including his 55cm tail. It's spectacular tail of fanned feathers, when spread out, looks like a lyre (an ancient Greek musical instrument). Females are smaller. Lyrebirds are capable of imitating almost any sound. Mixed in with their own calls, clicks and song, you will hear them mimicking loud clear sounds made by other birds and mammals - including humans. They can mimic chainsaws, horns, alarms and even trains. They sing throughout the year, and scientists think that the

mimicry helps them to vocally set out their territory and defend it from other lyrebirds. They feed mainly on ground-dwelling insects, spiders, frogs etc. In the 1930s a small number were introduced to Tasmania amongst ill-founded fears it was in danger of becoming extinct. The Tasmanian population is currently thriving. It is now widespread and common throughout its large range. Lyrebirds are ancient Australian animals. The Australian Museum has fossils of lyrebirds dating back to about 15 million years ago. It appears on the reverse side of our ten cent coin. I recently saw a lyrebird running across the road and scrambling up the bank along Wootton Way. Pat

Crime August/September

Some time in the afternoon of Tuesday the 16th of September 2014 occupants of a property on Hubbards Rd North, Boolambayte lit grass clumps to reduce fire hazards around the house. They left the fire for a short time and then observed the fire to reach an old shed which was nearly fallen over. The fire began to spread through grass that was dry and 3-4 feet tall. The grass then spread around the property which has not been grazed for some time. The persons who lit the fire did not get the required permit and have been prosecuted for this offence.

Between 10 and 13 September 2014 person/s unknown person/s using unknown means have broken the lock of a ground floor front sliding glass door at Markwell Rd, Markwell to gain access. Once inside, the offender/s have been through a draw in the master bedroom. Also during the same timeframe, an old dairy shed separate to the residence, at the rear of the property was broken into via a ground floor side door. The lock to the sheds ground floor side door has also been broken by unknown means. Once inside, the offender/s have stolen a mig welder, ark welder, air compressor, mower, brush cutter & 2 fishing rods.

At 5.50pm 6 September 2014 police attended Willina Rd, Bunyah in relation to a report of stock on the road. Upon arrival about 5 cattle were located in the middle of the road way and apparently unconcerned about passing traffic. Inquiries identified the owner of the stock and she was contacted and the stock removed from the road. She was warned re the seriousness of the issue and the possible ramification. She was issued a warning for the offence of allowing stock to stray.

INFORMATION This month I have attached the first in a series of security tips for your information. This month is about farmhouse security. Call Outs: Despite the recent rain, July/August presented like an early start to the fire season. We were able to respond to 75% of the call outs with the remaining 25% having the trucks left in the shed as there were not enough fresh members to make up crews. We attended a few serious vehicle accidents and numerous property fires where owners had lit heaps and lost control of them in the wind. The big fire at Minimbah was attended for several days ... members came from Sydney to help rotate truck crews! If you intend to light up a heap, <u>PLEASE</u> check the weather forecast you could save yourself and your neighbours a lot of grief and us our lost income!

Funding: In April, brigade funding via various grant applications was mentioned. We were happy to report in the last issue, the support provided by the HCCU and now, we are elated by more success with another grant. The members based Rural Fire Service Association supports the Rural Fire Service in many ways, one being their grants programme. We applied for assistance in the form of cleaning, office, and crew welfare equipment and were successful!! The brigade would like to extend our thanks to the RFSA for their support of the our community.

Members: The brigade has 2 probationary members who have completed their Basic Firefighting course. They will now join the brigade as active firefighter's for the forthcoming fire season. However, we need <u>more members</u> as we would like to respond to 100% of the call outs in our area. Non-active members would also be greatly appreciated to help clean & maintain the gear and shed etc. If you would like more information, call us.

Property Inspections: Due to the dry Winter and a fine start to Spring, it is now essential to consider the coming Summer. If you would like an inspection or assistance with your Bush Fire Plan, call Mike Badcock.

Summer the season of bushfires : A hot dry Summer is coming and with the recent rains & warm weather, everything is growing !!

Be prepared ... start cleaning up, take the rubbish to the tip, do your fire plans, check water supplies, check/run pumps & sprinklers, put street numbers at the front gate, prune or cut back vegetation immediately around the house, ensure fire trucks can access your property, etc.

DROUGHT WORKSHOP BRINGS SOME RAIN

Karuah & Great Lakes Landcare arranged a ½ day workshop called **Coping with Drought** in conjunction with **Hunter Local Land Services** at Coolongolook Hall on Monday August 25. Despite some recent rain many landholders came to know more about options for protecting stock and pasture health in dry times.

Pastures Officer Peter Beale started with a graphic representation of just how much rain we need in our area for our predominantly summers pastures to flourish. Even in normal years there is usually a deficit in soil moisture due to the heat of summer. Subsoil moisture will not improve unless we get heavy rain and runoff now and in early summer. According to predictions, a dry spring is still highly likely. Even if conditions improve, summer pastures will not be good to graze until at least November. NRM Officer Albert Mullen shared some initiatives, including an opportunity feedlot, he has taken to give his animals a supply of feed until the hoped for summer growth. Thinking ahead, culling numbers early and having more feed options, reduces stress on animals and owners. Livestock Officer Liz O'Grady gave us many tips on feed budgeting. District Vet Jim Kerr gave us a comprehensive insight into the animal health issues we or our neighbours could be facing due to low feed levels of poor quality and how to avoid them.

Those in attendance were very appreciative of the information available and had many questions answered. There will be more workshops provided by Hunter LLS to keep rural landholders abreast of issues and seasonal conditions.
