Koala (*Phascolarctos cinereus*):

As we all know, the koala is a tree-dwelling marsupial with large furry ears, a prominent black nose, long sharp claws adapted for climbing and no tail. However did you realise that koalas in the north of Australia have soft, light grey fur, but further south, in Victoria and South Australia they have thicker

reddish-brown fur? They are also heavier and fatter due to insulating layers of fat to protect them from the harsher southern climate. What colour are our local koalas, are they more grey than brown or more brown than grey? And do they weigh as much as the southern koalas (females 8kg and males 12 kg) or are they in the lighter range (5-6 kg for females, 6-8 kg for males in Queensland)? Do we know enough about

been separated. Hunter Local Land Services will be running an early weaning workshop for cattle producers in the Upper Hunter looking at their options.



The new rules require motorists:-

to slow down to 40km/h when passing all emergency vehicles with their red and blue lights turned on, and to give way to any person on foot in the immediate area of the emergency vehicle. The rule applies to vehicles travelling in both directions, unless the road is divided by a median strip. Motorists should not increase their speed until they are a safe distance past the vehicle, so as not to cause a danger to anyone in the vicinity. Motorists who do not comply with the rule will face A \$448 fine and three demerit points.

Fences and grass fire are not compatible!

With summer approaching it is a good idea to clean under all fence lines and at least one metre on each side of the fence line. Grass fires cannot easily be stopped but by cleaning under and around the fences the damage can be minimised. And remember, even the cheapest of fences costs **LOTS of money** to replace
