# **BOGONG MOTH** (Agrotis infusa)

The Bogong moth migrates in huge swarms each spring from the western slopes and plains of Victoria, NSW and Qld to the high country of eastern NSW and Vic. Westerly winds sometimes carry them out to the coast and sea, where many perish. They progressively congregate at mountain granite outcrops in deep crevices and provide important food for the rare Mountain Pygmy-possums. In recent years they haven't arrived, possibly due to drought and pesticide use, and bright lights from towns and cities.

From 1st of September 2020 it is mandatory to obtain a fire permit.

This means that NO FIRES can be lit without a permit

# **OBTAINING A FIRE PERMIT IN WOOTTON**

- \* Contact your RFS Permit Officer: Michael Coventry on 4997 7155 or 0407 458 167
- \* The Permit Officer will assess your site and issue the permit.
- \* The permit must be with you when you light the fire.

# LIGHTING A FIRE WITH A PERMIT IN WOOTTON

- \* You are required to notify the Rural Fire Service on 1300 643 262 at least 24 hours prior to burning.
- \* You will be asked for ... your address, name, contact number, the fire permit number, and the day(s) you intend to burn or **register online** at: www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/notify
- \* Your information will be entered in a central database which can help reduce unnecessary emergency calls.
- \* You are required to notify your neighbours 24 hours prior to lighting up by; SMS text, Email, phone call, notice in their mailbox or pay them a visit. Remember, it is important to notify your neighbour to give them time to prepare; move stock, stay indoors if they have asthma, change their washing day, etc
- \* If you have registered online, the RFS will notify you with any change in weather conditions and will advise you to not proceed with the burn but it is your responsibility to check if a total fire ban is in place before you light up.
- \* Prior to lighting the fire, you must ensure that is safe to do so. Double check the weather, clear around the burn area, have water on standby to fully extinguish the fire if required.
- \* To assist the Wootton fire brigade *volunteers*, please advise Michael Coventry 0407 458 167 or Captain Adam Garnett 0428 272 629 whenever you are lighting up to avoid unnecessary emergency RFS calls.
- \* You have to stay in attendance until the fire is fully extinguished.

Following these rules will help the Wootton Community to stay bushfire safe

# The Myall Lakes Dingo Project

While Dingoes are covered by "Wild Dog" legislation, scientists are continuing to discover how they are a special part of Australian ecology and to develop and test non-lethal tools for Dingo management, and to further our understanding and appreciation of this iconic Australian carnivore. The Myall Lakes Dingo Project is a collaborative project involving collaring dingoes with custom-built satellite GPS collars to record the locations of the individual every two-hours to have an accurate picture of where the Dingoes spend their time.

# Things to consider before getting into bees

Backyard beekeeping is fast becoming the latest must do in sustainability, maybe it's the popularity of the Flow Hive many thousands sold in Australia alone, the plight of bees worldwide and increased exposure in the media or the fact active (Jelly bush or Manuka) honey is proving to be a replacement for Antibiotics in topical applications or bees are experiencing the perfect storm and it's a combination of all of these elements? The Beekeeping Bio security code of practice applies from the 1st of July 2020 which lays out your hive inspection and record keeping requirements as a beekeeper depending on how many hives you have. The requirements of the code are what all beekeepers should already be doing and is something you should be aware of before getting bees //beeaware.org.au/code-of-practice/

Bee clubs and private beekeeping courses offer a depth of knowledge and resources that are invaluable to new beekeepers. Most clubs also have honey extractors etc that are available to members to use when required and some also offer mentors for new beekeepers. It was once said the solution to the plight of bees was not a beekeeper with a thousand hives, but a thousand beekeepers with one or two hives each. This is possibly true, however those thousand beekeepers need to be confident and responsible keepers of bees and if you're keen to become one of them then seek out your local bee club, find an experienced mentor and be prepared to hopefully become obsessed with a wonderful creature.
