



Forest Kingfisher Todiramphus macleayii Measuring 190-220mm in length. coloured royal blue, turquoise and black and white. Breeds between late August and December and is usually silent except at this time, when you can hear a harsh trilling chatter, t'reek, t'reek or a highpitched repeated whistle. They nest in a burrow in a termite nest. Incubation is by both sexes and usually they have two broods a season. The Forest Kingfisher, also known as the Blue Kingfisher can be seen and heard in open forests now.



At a well attended meeting on 27th November 03 the brigade was informed by Captain Keith Graham that the Brigades Category 1 Tanker will be returned on Thursday 11th December 03. Unfortunately the tanker is still in Tuncurry undergoing repairs.

Even though we have experienced fairly good rains over the last month the sub-soil is still dry. Dangerous fire conditions could be upon us if we experience only 2 weeks of hot windy weather. With this in mind the return of the tanker was met with great relief.

Lightning Flash

We've had some pretty amazing lightning storms in the last couple of months so here's some information.

Lightning results from the buildup and discharge of electrical energy between positively and negatively charged areas. Most lightning occurs within the cloud or between the cloud and ground.

- The average flash of lightning could turn on a 100-watt light bulb for more than 3 months.
- The air near a lightning strike is hotter than the surface of the sun!
- The rapid heating and cooling of air near the lightning channel causes a shock wave that results in thunder.
- Your chances of being struck by lightning are estimated to be 1 in 600,000 but those chances can be reduced by following safety rules.

Lightning Fact and Fiction

Fiction: Lightning never strikes the same place twice.

Fact: Lightning has "favorite" sites that it may hit many times during one storm. Fiction: The rubber soles of shoes or rubber tires on a car will protect you from being struck by lightning.

Fact: Rubber-soled shoes and rubber tires provide NO protection from lightning. Fiction: People struck by lightning carry an electrical charge and should not be touched.

Fact: Lightning-strike victims carry no electrical charge and should be attended to immediately.



Lightning is potentially hazardous to both people and property. For example, in the period 1803 to 1992, there were 650 registered fatalities attributable to lightning in Australia. In addition, bushfires, which result in damage to the natural environment, property and loss of life, are also associated with lightning.
