Scaly Breasted Lorrikeet Trichoglossus chlorolepidotus 'Scaly breasted' aptly describes this bird, having different shades of green with yellow barring on the breast which look like scales. Their beak can be light orange to dark red as are their eyes. Their habits are similar to those of the Rainbow Lorrikeet and mixed flocks of the two species are often seen. They indulge in upside down, gymnastic movements when feeding. They are common in our area feeding on blossoms, berries, other fruit and seeds. Their non stop chattering and screeching can be heard when feeding. They breed in all months, except March and April, and nest in a tree hollow high above ground.

#### **BUSHFIRE DESIGN GUIDE**

#### **House Site**

Houses should be sited to minimise the risk - this may mean keeping away from steep hillsides where the intensity of the fire can double for each 10 degrees of slope, or ensuring enough cleared land is available between the house and the bush.

Landscaping

Several landscaping features can slow the momentum of a bushfire. These include rivers, lakes, dams, swimming pools, irrigated or green summer crops, orchards, vegetable gardens, sporting ovals or tennis courts. Many tree species have been classified as bushfire-resistant and can be used as wind breaks and barriers. These include native as well as imported species.

Design

Good design for bushfire-prone areas seeks to protect the house and its occupants from the five major dangers:-wind, ember attack, radiant heat, smoke, direct flame.

Principles such as simple rooflines, uncomplicated layouts, window protection, inbuilt water storage, fire-resistant materials (where necessary) and sprinkler systems can be integrated to achieve good protection as well as good design.

Essential Construction Requirements

Houses are classified by legislation as being in low, medium, high or extreme bushfire attack areas, or as being in the flame zone. Non-combustible materials are generally acceptable, but the use of timber is sometimes restricted. For more detailed information visit http://www.archicentre.com.au/bushfireguide.pdf
