#### **Glossy Black Cockatoos**

(Calyptorhynchus lathami) Glossy Black Cockatoos have a glossy black plumage and a red tailband on males, while females have a yellow or orange cheek patch. They are found along the eastern coast, from southern Queensland to eastern Victoria. They prefer to live in woodlands and forests and feed primarily on the seeds of casuarina trees. They have become rare and vulnerable so if you see a red tail flying overhead, it's a special sight to be enjoyed.



## Insect pest alert—Monolepta beetles (Monolepta australis)

Adults eat leaves and flowers of many plants weakening them and stopping fruitset. Larvae feed on roots, particularly grasses. Host plants include legumes, avocado, corn, eucalyptus trees, grasses, cotton, citrus, macadamia, mango and strawberry.



Some years they form swarms causing serious damage within a few hours and decimating a crop virtually overnight.

**LOOK OUT FOR "SCOUTS"** in advance of the main swarm, and spray with pyrethrum or neem oil. Use yellow/white sticky traps and white containers filled with water to lure and drown them. Monolepta beetle | Insects and Organic Gardening
