NATIVE ORCHIDS AROUND WOOTTON

In the Mid Coast region of NSW, fire is an important part of the landscape. The relationships between plants, animals, fire and fuel are complex and current knowledge of how these components interact with each other is limited. In relation to orchids, fire and it's temperature impact almost each species differently. Some orchids:

- require disturbance as a result of fire to clear an area so they can establish themselves
- need fire, sometimes very hot in order to flower
- · won't flower after a fire as they aren't resistant to it.

Threatened orchids that you can find in our region include the Leafless Tongue Orchid, Pale Yellow Doubletail Orchid, Small Snake Orchid, Eastern Underground Orchid, Southern Swamp Orchid and others. Some of these are threatened because of irregular fire regimes, increasing weed populations as a result of fire clearings and habitat destruction and fragmentation.

own small personal artwork on the day. Please see below for some examples of the works created.










Wallawa Ngurrampaa Art Exhibition


Nibblies, a light meal and dessert will be provided but please BYO drinks.

Seasonal conditions update

As predicted, it seems we are heading into a dry winter. Landholders that rely on planted feed are finding that it is slow to grow this season due to lack of rain. As a result, landholders are looking to silage or hay to supplement animals. It is time to tighten grazing management and feed budget. Traditionally we have little growth in the grasses till September. Beware of overgrazing as bare paddocks have poorer infiltration rates and take longer to recover when it does rain. Paddocks with sparse ground cover are magnets for early succession pasture plants, which are often considered weeds, think fire weed and giant Parramatta grass for example.

It is a great time to weed tree lots and prepare for planting shade and shelter once we get some rain
