Black Jezebel butterflies (Delias nigrina) are nomadic and



some of our most colourful and graceful visitors, with many relatives in Australia and Asia. The topside of the wings on males is very similar to "Cabbage White" butterflies that are such a garden pest, but *Delias* caterpillars are no problem. Birds avoid eating them, because they contain toxic chemicals from mistletoe plants that their caterpillars eat.

The Brush Turkey Café, a community-owned premises in Wootton, functioning as an art gallery and café, is looking for a new tenant.



NAIDOC WEEK 7-14 JULY 2024

"Urapun Muy" is the poster* created by artist Deb Belyea and means



'One Fire' in the Kalaw Kawaw Ya dialect of the Top Western Islands of the Torres Strait.
"The title of this work pays homage to Torres Strait Islanders and Aboriginal people everywhere, as we all have that one fire: our passion for our culture. In this work, I have depicted the

hands of our ancestors that have carefully dropped a burning ember on to a fire. This ember burns hot with intensity, stoking the flames, as it combines with the new fire. The linear detail shows the energy and power as cultural knowledge is transferred from our ancestors to us today. Culture is the fire that gives us knowledge, wisdom and purpose. It is our responsibility to maintain, practice, and pass on our fire to our future generations. Afterall, Culture keeps us Blak, Loud and Proud."

Wootton Rural Fire Brigade

During the colder months remember your house fire safety strategies and make sure you have an escape plan in case of fire. Also just as a reminder to us all to have our chimney cleaned every two to three years as a minimum. Ensure your smoke alarms are in good working order; use fire guards on open fire places; and keep flammable items, such as clothes, away from heaters & fire places. Also remember to clean the lint filter in your clothes dryer after every use.

The cooler months are the best time to prepare for the forthcoming fire season. Grass fires are a particular concern for the next fire season especially since the extended wet weather & resultant luxuriant growth. Please trim overhanging branches from your roof; mow grass and clear around your home; clear and remove leaves and debris from your gutters; and prepare a hose that reaches all around your home.
